Punctuation – speech marks ‘inverted commas’



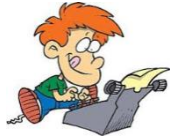
