PE/Outdoor Games/Swimming:

Indoor and outdoor PE are both on a **Tuesday afternoon**. Children need to bring to school appropriate indoor PE kit, including trainers. For outdoor PE, we will go out in most weathers. Children need to be warm enough over the winter and cool in the summer. Therefore, dark tracksuit bottoms (preferably black) plain white t-shirts and plain dark jumpers/tracksuit tops are required in the winter, while plain dark shorts and white t-shirts are needed in the warmer months.

All earrings must be removed or taped over for PE sessions. If your child has their ears pierced, please ensure they can either remove them or provide micro-pore tape for them to be covered (this can be purchased in supermarkets and pharmacies.) If possible, it would be appreciated if children could leave earrings at home on PE days.

Y5 swimming sessions also take place on **Tuesday afternoons**. Each class will take part in 10 sessions. Jaguars will do the first block, starting on the 12th September, then Pumas. Children who are swimming will get their 2 hours of designated weekly PE time through the walk to and from swimming and the lesson itself so will not have additional PE sessions on a different day.



Reading books:

Children will soon be able to choose a library book to take home. When finished, these should be returned to school. Year 5 library day is Friday. Children also have access to books in our Year 5 book area.



Homework:

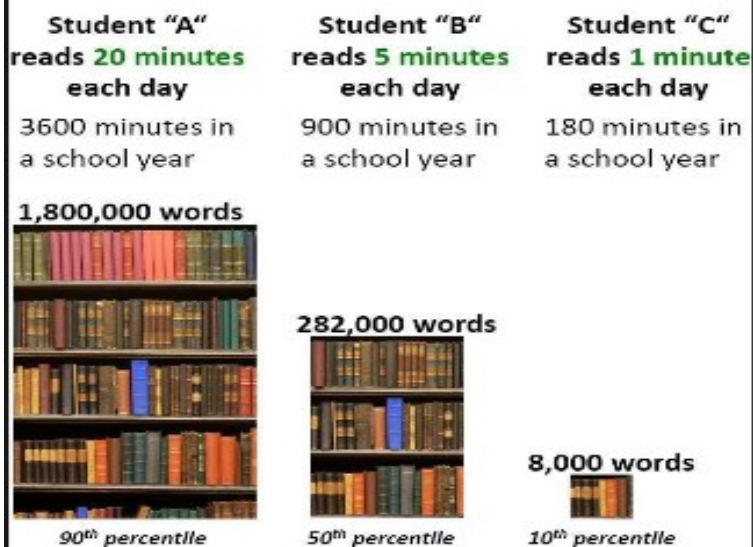
All children in Year 5 are expected to **read at home at least 3 times a week**. They will have received a reading record in which home reading can be recorded. Please read regularly with your child. In Year 5, it is still really important that the children are reading aloud to an adult and particularly, discussing vocabulary meanings.



Children also need to learn their **times tables** and **spelling lists**.

Sometimes, longer projects are set and when this happens, the due date and details will be sent out.
