

Welcome to Year 6

The children have settled in well to their new year groups. The following information is designed to help you understand what happens in Year 6 and how to support your child.

Timings Year 6 children should arrive in school **by 8:45am (doors open at 8:35am)**. They should be **collected at 3:05pm**.

PE/Outdoor Games/Swimming

Indoor and outdoor PE are both on a **Friday afternoon**. Children need to bring to school appropriate indoor PE kit, including trainers. For outdoor PE, we will go out in most weathers. Children need to be warm enough over the winter and cool in the summer. Therefore, dark tracksuit bottoms (preferably black) plain white t-shirts and plain dark jumpers/tracksuit tops are required in the winter, while plain dark shorts and white t-shirts are needed in the warmer months.



All earrings must be removed or taped over for PE sessions. If your child has their ears pierced, please ensure they can either remove them or provide micro-pore tape for them to be covered (this can be purchased in supermarkets and pharmacies). If possible, it would be appreciated if children could leave earrings at home on PE days.

<u>SATS:</u>

It is a statutory requirement for all children to sit SATs (standard assessment tests) at the end of Year 6 in English and Maths (unless they are significantly below expectations). Results are shared with secondary schools. SATs week begins 13th May 2024. Children will be not be authorised any absence during this week.

Homework:



All children in Year 6 are expected to read at home **at least 3 times a week.** They will have received a reading record in which home reading can be recorded. Please read regularly with your child. In Year 6, it is still really important that the children are reading aloud to an adult and particularly, discussing vocabulary meanings.

Children also need to learn their times tables and spelling lists.

Sometimes, longer projects are set and when this happens, the due date and details will be sent out.


Reading books:
