EARLY YEARS AND KS1 SPORTS DAY

Dear Parents/Guardians,

You are invited to join us on the morning of Thursday 25th June to enjoy the activities of Sports Day. We have a reserve date of Thursday 9th July if the weather is wet.

As in previous years, the morning will be in 2 parts: the Round Robin circuit and the running races. On the morning, we will make a decision on the order of these based on the weather.

Your child/children will be in the _____ Team, so it would be very much appreciated if they could wear a top of this colour. Please also ensure that earrings are removed or taped and that they have sensible running shoes, a hat and a bottle of water. Don't forget to apply sun cream if it is hot.

If you are joining us, you are welcome to bring a rug or chair to sit on. There is often a break between the two sessions and you may want to bring a drink for yourself.

Please make sure you watch the races from the opposite side of the track to where the children are sitting (they will be on the side nearest to the junior school building) and that you do not cross through any barriers that have been set up. These are there for the safety of your children.

We would also ask that all spectators support the positive and inclusive spirit of Sports Day by encouraging all participants and respecting the decisions of staff throughout the morning. This helps to ensure that the event remains enjoyable for every child.

The whole morning will be held on the junior side of the field, and we would appreciate your support in ensuring that children stay with their class as getting the children organised after play may cause problems if they stay with you. Please remember that the whole school site is non-smoking. Photos are allowed but please do not post any photos of other children on social media sites.

The activities will start around 9.20. We hope it is a fine morning and that you are able to join us. As always, thank you for your ongoing support in helping to make Sports Day a positive, enjoyable, and memorable experience for all of our children.
