
The start and end of the day

Doors open at **8.45am** and children can enter their class straight away. Registers are taken at **8.55am**. Every child in Year 2 is entitled to a free school meal. The choices are either a delicious hot lunch or a tasty hot jacket potato. School finishes at **3.00pm** when you will be expected to collect your child.



PE/Outdoor Games

Our PE days are **Monday** and **Friday**. In order to keep your child safe and healthy we won't be changing clothing at school so please send your child to school wearing their PE kit. They will require a pair of dark shorts, a plain white T-shirt, trainers or plimsolls. On top of this they should wear warm clothing as appropriate - plain dark tracksuit bottoms and plain dark sweatshirts/jumpers.



All earrings must be removed or taped over (using micro-pore tape) for PE sessions. If your child has their ears pierced, please ensure this is done at home.

Reading Books

Each child will be bringing home a reading book once a week but to keep within the safe regulations books will ONLY be taken home on a Friday and returned to school on the next Friday. Books that are returned will be placed in a separate box and cleaned before children can take them home again. If your child finishes reading their book, please re-read and discuss further (eg characters, making predictions, discussing other books that may be similar) as books will ONLY be changed on a Friday. Keep reading other books from home, too, as reading forms such an integral part to our learning!

Reading Records

Every child will be given a Reading Record and Phonics Log Book. This will be used to record reading completed at home. Please use regularly and ensure your child brings the diary into school every Friday alongside their reading book. There are ideas in the centre of the book to assist you with your child's reading. There is also a phonics guide and lists of all the words your child will need to be able to read as well as spell by the end of Year 2. These diaries should be looked after and last the whole academic year. Any child who loses their diary will be charged for a replacement at a cost of £2 each.




Homework:



All children in year 2 are expected to read **at least 3 times a week**. This should be recorded in the children's reading diaries which will be returned to school on a Friday.

Children will be receiving weekly spellings to learn. These will be tested weekly to ensure they are known. Children will also need to learn their 2, 5 and 10 times tables as well as begin to learn their 3 times tables.

Details about further homework projects will be sent home during each half term.
